Instructions and rules

Welcome to the 2017 Norfolk & Norwich Law Society Treasure Hunt – sponsored by Olsen Recruitment!

The "hunt" will take you round pubs in the local area. There are four compulsory pubs, namely St Andrews Brewhouse, Prime (Edith Cavell) on Tombland, the Red Lion in Bishopgate and the Wig & Pen on Palace Street. There are several pubs in between, which are optional. There is a map on the next page showing the route (St Andrews Brewhouse is your starting and finishing point).

You can choose your own team name. The best team name (in our absolute and final discretion) receives 5 bonus points. Write your team name on the front page of this answer pack (and keep all pages together - if we find errant pages, they won't count towards any team's marks).

The first four sheets feature clues between each of the pubs. You can choose which pub you start with, and can go in any direction (if everyone goes to Prime (Edith Cavell) to start, there will be a queue at the bar). It is polite to the host pubs to buy a drink at each pub.

Simply write your answers onto the question sheet. There is a lot to get through, so you will need to be quick!


Cheating is prohibited. As well as deducting 10 points for any cheaters, we also might (but won't) notify the SRA of dishonest conduct.




8. Norwich picture round

9. Bonus Round

For this bonus round, there are 35 points available.

Take a photograph of your team in each of the four compulsory pubs (St Andrews Brewhouse, Prime (Edith Cavell), Red Lion and Wig & Pen).

Post each photograph to Twitter, sending it to @NNLS2016 (not 2017 - Twitter wouldn't let us change it this year), stating your team name and the name of the pub you are in within the tweet (hashtags are optional). So, for example, if your team name is "Norfolk and Good" and you are in the Red Lion, the tweet accompanying the photograph would be as follows: "@NNLS2016 Norfolk and Good at the Red Lion". We may retweet each tweet via the NNLS twitter account.

Make sure your Twitter account is set to "public". If it is set to a private account, we might not be able to see your posts and you might therefore lose out on points. You can check the @NNLS2016 Twitter feed, and if your pictures aren't showing up then your account might be set to private and you might need to change your settings.

No points will be awarded simply for taking a photograph. The photograph must be posted to Twitter and tagged correctly.

10 points will be deducted if you post the name of a pub and it doesn't look from your picture like you are actually at that pub.

In 2018, Break charity will be distributing animals across Norwich, as it has done with dinosaurs and gorillas in the past. 2018 will see hares as the new theme. Your team must pose as hares / bunnies outside Norwich Cathedral (not the Roman Catholic one), and have Norwich Cathedral in the background. Ideally, you will find a kindly passer-by to take the picture of all four of you (or however many of you there are in your team).

Points are awarded as follows:

- 1 point for each of the 4 individuals of a team photographed at each of the 4 compulsory pubs plus bonus points to make it up to 5 points in total per pub if your whole team is in the photograph (so, for example, if you have a team of 4 you will get a bonus 1 point for a full team whereas a team of 3 would get 2 bonus points for a full team, to make it up to 5 for a whole team)
- 10 additional points for posing outside the Cathedral and posting the image on Twitter
- An additional 5 points will be awarded for the best photo outside the Cathedral (at our absolute discretion)
